The Society of Environmental Toxicology and Chemistry (SETAC) Conflict-of-Interest (COI) Policy aims to provide transparency and protection for SETAC from any gain of individuals in a place of trust or their affiliations. The SETAC COI Policy broadly applies to SETAC operations and programs including employment, governance, and publications and is augmented by more specific policies, as needed.

SETAC welcomes science-based objective input from individuals from different disciplines and sectors, consistent with its principals and values. As such, all views are respected, and affiliation alone is never viewed as a conflict of interest. We believe that it is important that potential conflict-of-interest declarations are transparent to allow all responsible entities to collaboratively guard against biases and work towards science-based consensus.
